This will be an opportunity for the Federation to put the record straight from their perspective.



Brian Churchill Delivers Third Henry Ford Oration

Brian's presentation took us on a visual tour of the Ford Highland Park plant in the 1910's, preceded by a brief visit to the Piquette Avenue Plant which produced the 'Alphabet Fords' (B, C, F, N, R & S) from 1904 onwards. The Club is deeply appreciative of Brian's research and quality of presentation, and the good news is that he will return next year to again deliver the Henry Ford Oration.

Render unto Caesar...

The A.O.M.C's *Iain Ross* reports that the Federal Government has decided not to repeal the Luxury Car Tax on vehicles over 30 years old at this time. There is some good news however. The Historic Vehicle Interest Group's submission to the Federal Government resulted in the following statement from the group: The Federal Budget was delivered last night. In our submission are highlighted the inconsistencies between GST and LCT regimes where a car is exported to be restored, and then reimported. Presently, the GST is only applied to the value of the work done on the car plus freight and insurance, whereas LCT is charged on the full restored value. The LCT is now removed in its entirety on cars reimported into Australia following refurbishment overseas, from January 2019.

15. Speaker – Brian Churchill

'A Factory Tour 1903 to 1930'

Brian delivered a fascinating presentation and 'tour' of Ford's famous production facilities in Detroit from the early 1900s through to the late 1920s. The 'tour' started with a brief visit to the lesser known Piquette Avenue Plant which commenced in 1904 producing the so-called 'Alphabet Fords' (B, C, F, K, N, R & S) and in 1909 was the birthplace of the Model T. The factory still stands today and is remarkably well preserved. It now operates as a museum to Ford. Piquette was eclipsed in just five short years by the most famous of Ford's plants being the Highland Park Facility. This facility, of more than 100 acres, employed over 20,000 people and was the home of the moving assembly line producing 15 million Model T Fords.


In September 2018 the Victorian Automobile Chamber of Commerce turns 100.
