Greg Smith recognised the DeDion Bouton shown in the November FLASHBACK photo. The 1904 De Dion Bouton pictured was of course the Markoff vehicle. I recall it was driven by Bernie McManus on most occasions, and I seem to recall he sported a great moustache and often wore a boater hat and maybe a striped blazer. I am sure someone will correct this if I am incorrect. From my poor memory, I seem to recall that the Harry Markoff De Dion Bouton ended up going to NSW. Again someone will correct exactly where if I am incorrect. Really nice little De Dion, that would be well suited to the Pioneers Event!!

We also know this car was advertised for sale in 1971 in the Antique Automobile magasine (USA) - see the ad reproduced below. We do not know of its current location.

This was a superb opportunity to showcase not only the historic movement, but also the depth of historical knowledge that our Club is the custodian of, with motor vehicles and their role in Victoria's early years.

Walt Disney - Christmas, Disneyland and Cars...



For many Walt Disney is synonymous to Christmas think movies such as *A Christmas Carol, The search for Santa Paws, Mickey's Once Upon a Christmas, Arthur Christmas, The Muppet Christmas Carol...* that's just a few, and Disney also has produced an extensive collection of Christmas films, specials and television episodes. For others, the television specials featuring Disneyland decked out in its Christmas livery is part of the magic of Christmas – something to dream about. Walter Elias Disney was born in Chicago in 1901 – in fact his early life tracks the veteran era of the automobile and the Disney Corporation picks up the story:

The 'car culture' of famous filmmakers is a long and storied one. Since the earliest days of the silent film, Southern California has seen a veritable parade of Pierce Arrows, Cadillac Phaetons, Rolls-Royce and roadsters were all as much a symbol of Hollywood success as a house in Beverly Hills. Walt Disney, too, enjoyed his own cars, but unlike other celebrities of his day – and today – Walt's was not a constant love affair. In fact, Walt recalled, 'I never owned a new car until way after Mickey Mouse'. Walt was both a povertywrought Midwesterner and an ambitious man, and frequently his own wants and needs were superseded by the needs of his business ventures.

Walt's wife, Lillian, recalled that he would frequently drive Lilly and Kathleen Dollard, an 'ink and paint girl' home. 'We used to work nights,' Lilly said. 'By that time he had a Ford roadster with one seat and an open back. He used to take us home after work.'

Recovering from the financial loss of *Oswald the Lucky Rabbit* in 1928 (and ramping up a whole new cartoon series to replace it) spelled the end for Walt's beloved Moon Roadster. The New York sound recording sessions for '*Steamboat Willie*' proved to be very expensive. The Disney brothers needed every dime they could squeeze out. 'So I had this beautiful Moon Roadster'. After initially listing the car for \$525.00, it was sold within a week for \$475.00. It's interesting to note that this sale was made in the first week of November 1928.

Even though Mickey Mouse quickly became a hit, it took many years for Walt and Roy's fortunes to recover. 'We mortgaged our homes, sold our cars, and went without things for a good many years after Mickey Mouse was a big success. I still didn't have a new car. Things were going pretty good. I splurged. I got a Packard – a brand new one'.

Later, Walt gave up his blue 1942 Packard Custom Convertible Coupe for a 1948 Oldsmobile 98 Deluxe Convertible Coupe. Walt was featured in a series of colour magazine advertisements (photographed at his Los Feliz Hills home) praising the practical aspects of the new DeSotos. Walt's last car is fondly remembered by one of his film stars, Dean Jones. 'He passed a Mercedes dealership,' Jones says, 'He looked in the window and saw this little two-seater. They were about \$11,000 at that time.' Disney had been a heavy smoker since World War I. He did not use cigarettes with filters, and had smoked a pipe as a young man. In November 1966, he was diagnosed with lung cancer and was treated with cobalt therapy. On November 30 he felt unwell and was taken to St. Joseph Hospital where, on December 15, ten days after his 65th birthday, he died of circulatory collapse caused by lung cancer.

It's those special things that count...

Rally Directors *Les Johnson* and *Jeff Alcock* are to be congratulated for their eye for detail in adding those special things that made the Overland rally something really special at Orange NSW. Les enlisted the help of his granddaughter Sophie to 'man' the lollie tray at the 1920's picture theatre – yes, complete with orange Jaffas to roll down the wooden floor. There was even some 'tut-tutting' from some diehard royalists when only a handful of patriotic souls stood for the 1940's version of 'God Save the King'. (King George VI died 6 February, 1952 from lung cancer aged 56), and I assume that those who remained seated were loyal to Her Majesty.

The producers of the Jon Faine program really put some colour into the show with their choice of music. The Allison Hadfield interview on Australian Hot Rodding was introduced with *lke Turners – Rocket 88*.

UK Radio DJ Mark Radcliffe wrote in his book '*Reelin in the years*': It's generally accepted that the first rock 'n' roll record was '*Rocket 88*', recorded in 1951 by *lke Turner* and his Kings of Rhythm. It had a new aggressive distorted sound allegedly resulting from rainwater getting into lke's

amplifier in the boot of his car. Another version of the tale has the same amp falling off the roof rack and suffering significant damage. Whichever you choose to believe it seems that the birth of rock 'n' roll owes something to Ike's very casual attitude to automobile maintenance and/or road safety.

The song is a hymn of praise to the joys of the Oldsmobile Rocket 88 automobile which had been introduced in 1949. Sam Phillips, owner and pioneer of Sun Records in Memphis claimed *'Rocket 88'* as 'the first rock and roll song'. Sun Records today is a tourist attraction, which I have visited on two occasions. The lead into the *Ian Berg* interview on *Dementia Prodest* was a song by *The Triffids* – an Australian alternative rock and pop band formed in Perth back in May 1978 with David McComb singer, songwriter, guitarist, bass guitarist and keyboardist. His song: *Wide Open Road* was released in 1986.

'How much did it cost?

And Graham replied with this pearler:

'Married men never keep records of a restoration!'

1&2 Cylinder Nationals Charleville 2020

Rhonda and Ross Guthrie are busily promoting the 1&2 Cylinder Charleville event, and I caught up with them at Orange. Although they don't have an Overland, they were wonderful company – a delightful couple! They tell me that so far there is are 68 expressions of interest (EOI's) - and a good number from Victoria (Lena and I have registered). And how many entries do they expect? 'We're getting closer to our magic number – don't ask what that number is as we all have a different number in mind'.

'Old Whitey' – Willys Overland legend...

'Paul, make sure you catch up with Graham Crittenden, at Orange' so advised John Stanley 'and send him my regards'. I did, and the tale of Old Whitey is one of Queensland's motoring legends. In 1916 the car at 81.8mph on Perriau 3 rib tyres at Southport Beach (a world record) and later set a new record of 2 hours and 7 1/2 minutes for the journey from Brisbane to Toowoomba. Graham Crittenden acquired the car in 1966 for \$2,000, and it sat on his farm for over 30 years before he began the restoration. A highlight of the rally was the starting of the original experimental SR4-8 V8 engine that was originally briefly trialled in Old Whitey back in 1916 - back then it scared the living daylights out of the driver Fred Eager in just 20 minutes of gyrations. Today the engine resides in a veteran chassis that is being restored by David Crisp, and it was an historic moment when the engine was started for the first time since 1916.

The Cape

CAPE SCHANCK 10-11 November 2018

This was a terrific rally which sent close to 50 Veteran vehicles and their passengers on a 'hold onto your hats' rollercoaster of a journey highlighting the scenic beauty of the Mornington Peninsula. The weather was delightfully fresh and clear with everyone radiating a spirit of adventure.

Rally Headquarters were at the mammoth RACV Cape Schanck Resort, which is remarkable in its design and quality, exuding an aura of mystique and luxury enhanced by ocean vistas, rugged coastal vegetation and a fabulous new golf course. The landscaping is in its infancy and on a massive scale. Given a few years for the gardens to mature, the complex will evolve into an even more spectacular destination and blend seamlessly into the landscape.

Saturday 10th November took us on a 113 km, somewhat challenging ramble for many, through rich countryside dotted with countless vineyards and lush pastures and forests through the hilly areas of Shoreham, Red Hill and Merricks. The dear little 1913 Swift owned by Loretta Marron and Gavin Mutton who had travelled all the way from Queensland, suffered a critical radiator problem very early into the run and was returned to base. Lis, Karl and Alexander Donald's delightful 1910 Renault ground to a halt with fuel contamination on a very tricky hill section. The RACV support vehicle isolated the problem and soon had

the Renault on the road again with Lis and Alexander scorching along to eventually catch up with the pack by lunchtime.

The Coolart Historic Area with its lovely old mansion and gardens to explore provided a welcome rest stop before continuing to Crib Point for lunch at the local RSL. Plenty of time here to sit and chat inside or wander outside to admire the Veteran vehicles resting under the trees in readiness for the afternoon leg of the journey. Here, we were enchanted with Scott Staples' battered, bruised and unconditionally loved left-hand drive 1913 Ford T Model, its folded hood tattered and torn and with any hint at shiny brass or smart upholstery lost long ago. Barry Gomm and Roma Thomson in the 1909 Aries, Ian and Sue Berg's 1910 Cadillac and George and Fiona Forbes' 1912 Rolls-Royce Silver Ghost were magnificent sights to savour.

The afternoon return run took us through more glorious countryside with ocean panoramas via Flinders. We navigated steep hills, eyebrow-raising downhill sections and eye-popping sharpish curves, arriving back at the resort late afternoon with time to scrub up for the evening rally dinner and to enjoy its 1950's "Remember When" theme. Various club members dressed the part and others held the microphone to entertain us with their reminiscences of past events held so many times over the decades in this lovely area of Victoria.

We had left home on the Thursday morning preceding the Rally in our 1913 French Th. Schneider, a day ahead of time, enjoying a relaxed journey through Anakie and Geelong with a stop at the Portarlington bakery before our first night stopover at Barwon Heads. Early Willys Overland Roundup - Orange, 14–19 October

The Early Willys Overland Roundup represented the largest gathering of 100 year old Willys Overland vehicles anywhere in the world. The event marked the Centenary of the Sydney to Brisbane record of 19 hours 38 ½ minutes set by Fred Eager and Wally Webb on 19th & 20th October 1918 in Old Whitey, a Willys Overland Model 61T. This reduced the previous record by 6 ½ hours.

Graham and Marjorie Crittenden from Kingaroy restored Old Whitey and brought her to the event. Also present was David Crisp from Crookwell with his Model 8-88 fitted with the experimental V8 racing engine that had been developed for Indianapolis and once been fitted to Old Whitey. This engine had not run for 100 years and was successfully started on the anniversary, Friday 19th October by organiser Les Johnson's son Rick and visiting American owner and Willys expert Greg Gumtow.

A full week of activities was organized for the group including:

- Lineup of all the vehicles and their owners at Orange Showground and a welcome by the Mayor of Orange, Reg Kidd
- Run to Millthorpe and lunch at the museum where Les & Rick Johnson and visiting Americans Duane & Rebecca Perrin were interviewed by Win News

- Run to Manildra via Cumnock. At Manildra Tom's Overland Garage was decorated with Overland signs made especially for the day. Lunch was served in the Museum and some old movies were shown in the Amusu picture theatre, home of Tom Allen the Picture Show Man
- Morning tea and photo opportunity at historic Duntryleague followed by a run to Banjo Patterson Park and the Botanical Gardens which also offered lunch
- Run to Abercrombie House at Bathurst where lunch was served followed by a visit to Mt Panorama. The hills encountered on this trip were a real challenge both on the way up and more so on the descent where rear drum brakes were the sole form of retardation
- A leisurely lap or two of the Gnoo Blas Circuit at Orange, home of the first FIA sanctioned event in Australia won by Jack Brabham. A picnic lunch was served at Lake Canobolas
- Dinner at Duntryleague where many of the members came in period dress and Graham Crittenden showed some photos of the restoration of Old Whitey

A large number of the vehicles were still running at the end of this arduous week.

Old Whitey

The 2018 Orange Roundup marked the centenary of the Sydney to Brisbane record set by Fred Eager and mechanic Wally Webb in Old Whitey, a 1912 model 61 Overland.

The car was the promotional vehicle for AP Eagers Ltd, a company started by Fred's father Edward and the Southern Hemisphere distributor for Willys vehicles.

There were few made roads in those days and Old Whitey made ascents of Mount Glorious, Mount Gravatt and Tamborine Mountain; this often involved pioneering the road.

The car at that time had wooden wheels and was a 45hp Overland Speedster.

In 1916 the car ran at 81.8 mph on Perdriau 3 rib tyres at Southport Beach and later set a new record of 2 hours and 7.5 minutes for the journey from Brisbane to Toowoomba. The time was recorded by a watch in a sealed packet carried by the driver and opened on arrival.

On October 19th and 20th 1918 Fred Eager and Wallace Webb took 6 and a half hours off the record for Sydney to Brisbane.

They started at 10pm from the GPO in Sydney and made it to Wisemans Ferry in 1 hour 35 minutes. This was 25 minutes ahead of the schedule. 18 minutes was immediately lost by the next 6 railway gates being closed; they lost 5 minutes at Murrandi changing a spark plug and another 10 minutes at Wallabadah changing the entire set.

There were no further troubles encountered and they got to the Central Northern Garage at Tamworth at 6.05, on schedule. A quick breakfast was followed by a departure at 6.30 am and arrival at Armidale at 8.15, again on time.



They then lost 8 minutes to Glen Innes and a further 4 minutes to Tenterfield but had made up 6 minutes by the Queensland border and a further 12 minutes by Warwick.

The run to Brisbane in 3 hours 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes included a 10 minute stop for some fruit and a cup of tea and the arrival time in Brisbane was 5.38 $\frac{1}{2}$ pm. This represented an average of just over 35 mph.

The fastest train time between the two cities was 27 hours and 10 minutes which rather puts Old Whitey's time in perspective.

The car used two front tyres which had previously been used to win the Mt Cootha Hill Climb and two

new rears. They were Goodyear No Hook Straight Wall Cord Tyres and they did not need to be replaced on the route.

They chose a full moon for the run and had fine weather as well.

A further factor had been the Eager distribution network who had paid farmers and railway staff to have gates open at the time the car was due. They also had ferries waiting on the right side of the crossings irrespective of the number of cars waiting on the other side to cross.

Its not clear what happened to old Whitey after 1918 but Joe Wilson 'found' the car in 1959 in an old garage and told the Guthrie family who eventually acquired the car in 1962 for 150 pounds and used it in club events.

Graham Crittenden acquired the car in 1966 for \$2,000 and was fortunate that Wally Webb was still alive and working at Eagers and was able to help with the restoration.

At one stage the car had had a tray back fitted and had been used for stump pulling on a property. Graham recalls that the axles were twisted through 45 degrees. They had to be replaced. It also took 15 years to find the correct number 6 Houk wire spoke wheels.

Willys Indianapolis V8 starts after 100 years

Around 1915 Willys made a number of experimental SR4-8 racing engines with a view to competing at Indianapolis. One of these engines was imported by Fred Eager of A.P. Eager Ltd in 1916 and he arranged for his racing mechanic Wally Webb to fit it to the firms promotional vehicle, Old Whitey.

The current owner of Old Whitey, Graham Crittenden, discussed the end result with Wally, the man who sat beside Fred Eager on all his record runs, and he refused to get into the car. Fred proceeded solo and returned in less than 20 minutes after a few gyrations. Wally's assessment had been correct and the engine was not suited to that chassis.

The engine was removed and remained at A.P.Eagers Ltd for 65 years until David Crisp of Crookwell in NSW made them an offer which they accepted on 7th April 1981. It then sat in David's huge pile of bits for another 30 years before the project began to put the motor into a chassis and built a suitable body for it.

David selected a 1917 Willys Knight Model 8-88 Chassis and did all the mechanical work in his own workshops. There had been no exhaust manifolds on the engine and simple stub exhausts were fitted.

The original V8 radiator had stayed in Old Whitey and obtaining a suitable one proved quite difficult.

A body was now required and Robert McLachlan at Gosford was approached to build this. Les Johnson picked the car up in his covered trailer in March 2018 and took it there, in the hope that it could be completed in time for the October Roundup at Orange. It was completed in July and Les picked it up and took it back to Crookwell.

It was in this state that the car arrived (on Les trailer) at Orange. It had fluids in it but had not started. American Willys expert Greg Gumtow was also at Orange and he had a rare V8 production model and was thus quite familiar with the type of engine.

Greg, and Les Johnson's son Rick, tried to start the engine between rain storms on Thursday 18th October and it just wouldn't go. The next day was the centenary of Old Whitey's record and after a few coughs and splutters the V8 burst into life for the first time in more than 100 years.

<u> The Grimwade family – Pioneering Motorists</u>

Our 2018 Annual Rally visited the Coolart Wetlands and Homestead for the Saturday morning break. In viewing the homestead I noted that it had originally been owned by FS Grimwade. I knew the Grimwade family were a family of successful Melbourne businessmen and philanthropists but there is also an early motoring connection. Some basic research revealed a fascinating story.

Frederick Sheppard Grimwade came to Australia as a 22 year old in 1862 and established a wholesale medicinal drug company. He went on to develop businesses in manufacturing acids, salt, glass bottles, fertilisers and eucalyptus oil. Together with his wife Jessie he lived in Caulfield in a large house 'Harleston' (now 'Grimwade House', owned by Melbourne Grammar), and they raised their family. Grimwade purchased the Coolart property as a family retreat in 1895, at that time it was some 2000 acres. Very soon after he commissioned the construction of the mansion. He retained the property until 1907 and Coolart then went through a succession of owners. In 1977 descendants of the Luxton family, another prominent

Melbourne family sold the property to the Victorian State Government. The mansion, wetlands and some 89 acres remain as a reserve.

Frederick Grimwade was apparently interested in the emerging motor car, and the third Tarrant motor car to be produced, a two cylinder model was built for him in 1903. He died in 1910, and his considerable business empire was left to his three sons Edward Norton, Harold William and Wilfrid Russell.

Even wider were the interests of the youngest son, Wilfrid Russell Grimwade who was born in 1879 and was to take an active role in expanding the family businesses. Apart from his business interests Russell Grimwade was a conservator, botanical enthusiast, photographer and adventurer. He too was a motoring enthusiast and was to participate in the 1906 Dunlop Reliability Trial in a 4 cylinder 16hp Tarrant taking a class win (refer *Dementia Prodest*)

A notable undertaking of Russell Grimwade was that he, together with a GP Smith was the first person to complete a motor trip between Melbourne and

Adelaide. They took five days between May 30 and June 3 in 1905 and drove a 10hp two cylinder Argyll. We are fortunate that he kept a diary and it remains in the University of Melbourne Archives. He and Smith reported that the journey was 'exceptionally unpleasant' as a result of the poor road conditions and heavy rain. Not only did this dampen their spirits but also their sandwiches and matches - denying them the opportunity for a smoke!

As an adventurer himself Russell Grimwade was an admirer of James Cook, and in 1933 acquired Captain Cook's Cottage from the village of Great Ayton, Yorkshire. With the support of the Victorian Government he brought the building to Victoria, and it was gifted to the Victorian people for the centenary of Melbourne's foundation. It was first opened to the public in October of 1934 having been reassembled brick by brick following the journey from England.

Russell Grimwade was generous to many causes, and clearly a very interesting man. He was knighted in 1950 and died in 1955.
