Federation of Veteran Vintage and Classic Vehicle Clubs Inc

Last month I advised you of the Club's decision to remain a member of the Federation (for review next year), and that also we continue to be unhappy with their demand that we liaise through their solicitors on the issue of the Luxury Car Tax on imported vehicles. Your Committee considers that a single unified voice for the movement is needed. We are not the only club with issues with the Federation – the President of the Buick Car Club is also taking the Federation to task in their August magazine.

Here's some extracts:

On the need for a single voice for the movement:

The argument that historic motoring clubs in Victoria need a single representative voice is an entirely valid one. The AOMC and Federation should perform an identical role, there is no tangible difference in the purpose of their respective existence. To drag organisations such as ASRF and CAMS into the discussion is pointless and misleading, Street Rods and Motor Sports are different beasts requiring different agendas unlikely to be effected by the same issues as the collector car enthusiast. There is no reason we need both the AOMC and Federation especially since they have shown no ability to work together at any level.

On Correspondence via Solicitors:

A number of member clubs have raised serious concerns regarding the running of the Federation recently and have had their questions met not by detailed answers or clarifications, but by threats and solicitors letters, disgraceful bullying by a so-called representative organisation. An organisation with a virtually identical constitution to our own which includes a very detailed dispute resolution procedure, a procedure that does not include the sending of solicitors letters to members demanding retractions or apologies.

It seems the Federation is running into a real head wind with some of its members, and our Club's representatives, *Andrew McDougall*, *Daryl Meek* and *Brian Hussey* will be vigilant voices on our behalf.

Aussie Invader – Rosco McGlashan

It was back in 1994 that *Rosco McGlashan* drove his Aussie Invader to 500mph (802.6km/h) at Lake Gardiner, South Australia. Rosco is a true Australian hero of mine, and he has spent the last nine years with his team building a car capable of breaking the sound barrier and moving on to 1000mph. The car is 'Aussie Invader' 5R, powered by liquid bi-propellant rocket engine producing around 62,000 lbs of thrust (about 200,000 horsepower). Rosco follows the trail blazed by the likes of Henry Ford, who on January 12, 1904 drove the car '999' to a land speed record of 91.37mph (147.05km/h).

The current owner managed Jerry Lewis for over 20 years, for all affairs outside of the USA and was considered part of the family. The Rolls Royce was given to the owner as a birthday gift in December 2009. Comes with two keys 1 – 14 Karat Gold Rolls Royce 'Master Key' – The key with the Rolls Logo on it is actually made by Tiffany. The other Gold Key was made up by Jerry.

Also with the vehicle is: *Transfer Letter Signed* – Original letter from Mr Jerry Lewis acknowledging receipt of funds. *Fax Confirming Transfer* – A Fax from Mr Jerry Lewis's office, confirming transfer of title.

On the 21-22 of July we were invited to be passengers in Stan Bone's 1910 FN veteran car as part of the RACV Midwinter Rally, held at the RACV Goldfields Resort Creswick. On Saturday morning we left the resort at 10:30am and headed off to Clunes a distance of 62.3 km. We were in no doubt at all why it is called a mid-winter rally, it was brass monkey weather, but we soon had the blood flowing as we motored along at a Brisk 55 km/hour. We arrived in Clunes, and had a beautiful lunch at the National Hotel.

The return trip was only 34 km back to Creswick, where we got the glad rags on and had a first class

meal at The Resort that evening, where the stories of the day were told and the rules of the cold start comp. were made clear.

Eleven of the 40 cars in the rally were to start in the Cold Start Competition at 9.30 am next morning. Stan asked Kevin if he would take his place in the event as he felt Kevin would have a better chance of winning.

The event rules state when you blow the horn your time starts then you crank the engine till it starts then run around the cones and when you blow the horn again the clock stops. Kevin's time was 9.7 sec placing him fourth.

The winner did it in 8.6, a much younger man, as where all the place getters that did a faster time than Kevin. Having had a good laugh and got rugged up for the final run of 38.3 km, Creswick back to Creswick Woollen Mills where we had lunch of hot soup to warm up as it was colder than yesterdays runs.

The rally finished back at the Goldfields Resort a run of 4.2 km. This weekend was a very unique undertaking, one that only comes once in a life time. The chance to ride in a car that is 108 years old with all the cars older than 100 years is the sort of weekend that dreams are made off. Thanks to all the people that made this possible.

<u>60 years ago - Reflections on our Annual Rally for 1958</u>

Our Annual Rally for 2018 has a *Remember When* theme and is headed towards the Mornington Peninsula. With this in mind, as well as the imminent release of our Club history *Dementia Prodest* it is opportune to look back at what the Club was doing 60 years ago. Hopefully this will also whet your appetite for what you can expect in the Club's history book - our launch is only 10 sleeps away!

Sixty years ago the third Golden Fleece Veteran Car Rally was held on the weekend of November 15 and 16, with the overnight destination being Sorrento. There were 77 entries, with entry number 77 being allocated to the 1896 Thomson entered by Bill Buchanan. As it turned out there were 74 starters on the Saturday, headcount was 157 with competitors and Club officials, and at the Velodrome finish, 65 entrants had successfully completed the rally. The finish included an appearance from Miss Australia 1958, Pam Mackay and as had been the case on the two previous annual rallies the RSL Marching Girls put on a wonderful display for the crowds.

Our President at the time, Norm Strack congratulated the entrants for the improved condition and appearance of the cars.

The Club *Newsletter* following the event included a review of the rally by Norm with the following comments, some having stern overtones;

- The Le Mans start was a success but did not achieve the outcome of cars travelling in groups for public interest. Norm was interested in members ideas on this.
- The visit to the Orthopaedic Hospital was a great success, but some members felt terrible sorrow for the children, many who had terrible afflictions. However collection points along the rally route yielded 900 pounds for the Children's Hospital Appeal, half of which was collected by the Golden Fleece Social Club members
- Number 74 was reported for dangerous driving and 48 for unduly fast driving not official bookings but friendly hints which all competitors should heed, that if we are to expect continuing help from the police, we must co-operate with them and observe every traffic regulation in full detail. As one police officer said to me, "There are 11 of my boys on this job and they are all doing their best for you. One foolish driver could easily turn them against you"
- The security storage was excellent at the Lord Mayor's Holiday Camp: nothing of value went off, but many drivers reported the loss of blue pennants why would outsiders pinch these?
- The appearance of two clowns in one of the cars was unexpected, unauthorised and unpleasant. It will not occur again.





Note the collection of funds was by the sponsor's social club, and also note the role of the police.



A Short Story Of A Trap In Re-Tyrement

Neil Robert has a cannon which fires tennis balls a surprising distance and emits a very loud report in doing so. Our Renault, on a recent rally, fired the left front tyre a quite amazing distance through a fence and into a paddock of long grass—accompanied by a frighteningly loud report. These two events have no connection other than the sound made but it was time to re-tyre the Renault.

I had been told by several people that our AX had Model T wheels. Indeed the tyres were Firestone 30 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ which of course is the size to fit Model T wheels. I called Antique Tyres and ordered 4 new 30x31/2 tyres, tubes and rustbands.

Bob Ballinger had given me a good demonstration on procedure, so I began with the offending left front wheel. No problem in removal of the old tyre and tube. Lathered everything new with talcum powder, including boots, clothing and floor. It looked easy when Bob did it and so it was for me. Tube into tyre followed by rustband, valve stem into hole, ease tyre and contents onto rim and work it around just as Bob had done. Easy. I began to think that I might have all 4 tyres fitted in under an hour. BIG MISTAKE. In fact it was TOOOO easy.

When I arrived at the opposite side of the wheel, the tyre would not seat. If I got it seated there, it unseated somewhere else. In fact it reminded me of my own waistline—push it in here and it pops out there. My diagnosis was that the tyre was too big and since they were labelled the same size as those which came off, I felt I had a "bodgie" set of new tyres. I loaded the lot, including the wheel and old tyre, into the Toyota and paid Mr. Ballinger a visit where the diagnosis was confirmed.

Back at Antique Tyres, Ben was extremely understanding and helpful and quite happy to do an exchange. His first question was "How long have the old tyres been on?" I really had no idea but I thought Forty years would cover it. We were then let into a secret. Until around 20 years ago, when they changed their moulds, Firestone 30x31/2 tyres were not really 30x31/2. Rather they were slightly smaller diameter. The new moulds are the correct size for 30x31/2. And it did prove that the existing tyres were at least 20 years old, having come from the old moulds.

The rims on the Renault were then measured and found to be a metric size and in all probability genuine Renault. Tyres at 28x3 will fit but looked like upholstery piping after being used to the (almost) 30x31/2 Firestones. A good (but more expensive) compromise was reached and our Renault now wears760x90 Ensign Chevron Cords. And they were a bugger to fit!


