RACV 1&2 CYLINDER RALLY, COBRAM 25-28 MARCH 2021

The first of our major rallies, in a jam packed 2021 calendar, will take place in Cobram on the last weekend in March. The uncertainty of not knowing what restrictions will be in place at the time has made it a difficult run to coordinate, with venues being unable to commit to and/or cater for such a large group. With this in mind, I have taken the 'K.I.S.S' approach and am focussing on two key aspects; driving the vehicles, and the ability to socialise with our fellow members, some of whom we may not have seen since Hamilton.

Thursday will consist of a short shakedown run for those who arrive throughout the day and want to test the results of their Covid tinkering before the big runs.

Friday will be the longer of the drives, heading into NSW to Berrigan for a picnic lunch and coming home via Tocumwal. It will be a total of around 120km for the full length however there will be a short route option in each direction which will almost halve the total for the day if used both ways. Dinner will be held at the RACV Resort, with some outdoor dining so not to exceed the expected density limits of their dining room.

Following a local community display first thing Saturday morning, we will be heading to Numurkah for lunch. A round trip of approximately 90km. The rally dinner will be held at the Barooga Sporties that evening.

Sunday morning will involve a short run for morning tea before returning to the RACV Resort at lunch time to allow you the afternoon to travel home.

As you can appreciate, the above is subject to change based on any changes in restrictions, however I'm remaining optimistic and hope to have an entry form ready in late January. The Club will also be trialling the new online system to submit your entry. The RACV Resort has the majority of the resort allocated to us, so I encourage you to contact them to lock away your accommodation; (03) 5871 9700.

Flashback Response

Last month's Flashback featured an image of Frank Dallimore and his Model T in the doorway of Tarrant Motors. The image featuring Frank was created using an original 1913 image. Both are shown and you will note that the background of both is identical, right down to the leaves on the tree! The picture is a fantastic tribute to Frank that someone has gone to great lengths to create.





As the story of Tarrant Motors would fill a couple of editions of Brass Notes, I will try to answer the other two questions that were posed. "Can anyone remember the building?" and "When was it demolished?".

The building pictured was the last of at least four premises occupied by Tarrant's. This expansive building was located at 104-112 Russell Street (the north-east corner of Russell and Little Collins Streets) and was built in late 1905 and early 1906. When opened in February 1906, The Tarrant Motors was the Victorian distributor for Argyll, De Dion Bouton, Mercedes and, of course, Tarrant. By 1908 the company was also the

authorized distributor for Britannia, FIAT, Rover and had obtained the sole rights to sell Ford in Victoria.

In 1933 Tarrant Motors consolidated with Olympia Motors, All British Motors, and Auto Car Industries under the title of Allied Motors. The precinct went on to become very much a motoring one, with many well-known motoring businesses having their premises nearby at some stage.

The original building was demolished in the mid-1980s to make way for the new skyscraper being built at 120 Collins Street. This building has a footprint that covers most of a City block was built between 1989 and 1991. It was the tallest in Melbourne before being surpassed by the Eureka Building in 2006.

Many thanks to Gif Hatfield for bringing to the editor's notice pages from the Story of Australian Motoring by Keith Winser (1956) that highlight the contribution of both Harley Tarrant and Tarrant Motors to early Australian motoring. A copy of this book is available for loan from the VCCA (Victoria) library.


Valē Hughie Tranter






